PLAN OF THE LAWYER REFERRAL SERVICE

The Rockland County Bar Association under the guidance of the American Bar Association, has established a Lawyer Referral Service ("The Referral Service") on a County-wide basis. The office is located at the Rockland County Bar Association, 337 North Main Street, Suite 1, New City, New York 10956.

The willing participation and continued support of lawyers practicing in Rockland County is crucial to the smooth operation of the Referral Service.

The purposes of the Referral Service are:

- To be a public service, available to assist the general public by providing an alternative source for any person who can afford to pay a reasonable fee for legal services and who does not have a lawyer by providing a referral to a lawyer who practices in Rockland County.
- To provide a vehicle for persons who need a legal representative but whose earnings or assets are too high for the standards set by Rockland County Legal Aid Society or Pro Bono New York; and
- To establish a better rapport between the public and the legal profession.

The Referral Service Plan is not designed to take clients away from attorneys. In fact, a cardinal principle will be to establish whether a prospective client has a present attorney. The Referral Service will not refer the client to a panel attorney of the Referral Service if we learn that a prospective client has seen other attorneys in an effort to bargain on fees. Additionally, a prospective client shall not be referred to a panel attorney if the prospective client has previously engaged the services of a lawyer on the same matter unless the original-lawyer-client relationship has been properly terminated in writing.

- 1. Membership on the Referral Service Panel is by individual attorney and not by law firm.
- 2. A panel attorney must abide by all of the rules of the Referral Service and will in no way hold, or claim to hold, the Rockland County Bar Association, the Referral Service or any of the members, officers or employees liable in connection with any referral made.

COMMERCIAL LITIGATION ISSUES OF INTEREST

Your client has an exclusive 10-foot-wide easement over his neighbor's property along their shared 27-foot-long rear property line. The neighbor's property is improved with a residential apartment building. The exclusive easement is for your client's personal use as a garden, patio, deck, storage, and other non-commercial uses. Your client plans to convert his multi-story industrial building into a residential condominium apartment building with a below-grade garden that is accessible from the basement and extends into the easement area. The garden will require excavation to 12 feet deep and construction of a new retaining wall. The neighbor refuses to allow your client to construct the garden. You bring an RPAPL Article 15 action to determine claims to real property, seeking a permanent injunction prohibiting the neighbor from interfering with construction of the garden. The neighbor moves to dismiss the complaint, arguing that the proposed excavation exceeds the rights conveyed by the garden easement. Will you defeat the motion to dismiss?

The answer is no.

In 41 Great Jones Holdings, LLC v. Bd. of Mangers of 40 Bond Condominium, 157032/2014, NYLJ 1202798314509 (Sup. Ct. N.Y. Co. 2017), the plaintiff brought an RPAPL Article 15 action to declare the parties' rights concerning a 99-year exclusive easement in favor of the plaintiff over a portion of the rear of the defendant's property. The plaintiff's and defendant's rear yards shared a 27-foot property line. The defendant's property contained a multistory residential building. The plaintiff planned to convert its multi-story industrial building to a residential building with a walk-out, cellar-level garden, extending into the easement area. The plaintiff refused to allow the defendant access to construct a below-grade garden, which required excavation to 12-feet deep.

In 2001, the prior owner of the defendant's lot conveyed the 10-foot by 27-foot, 99-year easement to the plaintiff along the rear property line for the plaintiff's personal use as a garden, patio, deck, storage, planting, light commercial storage of non-hazardous materials, and other non-commercial uses. The easement prohibited the construction of any building, structure, or other obstruction, and contained an acknowledgement that the grantor planned to construct a multi-story building immediately adjacent to the easement.

The plaintiff moved for summary judgment on the complaint and for a permanent injunction preventing the defendants from interfering with the excavation and construction. The defendant cross-moved to dismiss the complaint.

The Court cited a collection of cases discussing the principles governing a court's determination of the intent of an express easement. Ultimately, the Court determined that the plaintiff's right to erect a garden on the servient lot is not unfettered, noting that the holder of an easement "cannot materially increase the burden of the servient estate or impose new and additional burdens on the servient estate," citing *Solow v. Liebman*, 175 A.D.2d 120, 121 (2d Dep't 1991). The Court noted that it was unlikely that the two sophisticated parties would not have included "excavation" in the easement if they intended to authorize the grantee to undertake significant excavation or erect a use at a significant depth below grade. The significant construction for placement of a garden at 12-feet below grade "are neither reasonable nor necessary to fulfill the terms of the 99-year easement, and thus beyond the rights conveyed by the easement agreement...."

The Court denied the plaintiffs' motion for summary judgment and for a permanent injunction. The Court converted the cross-motion to dismiss the cause of action for declaratory relief into a motion for a declaration in its favor, citing *Pilgrim v. Pantorilla*, 144 A.D.2d 882 (2d Dep't 2016), and declared that "the easement does not permit the plaintiff to excavate the servient lot in the manner it has proposed, or to erect a garden 11-12 feet below grade level on that portion of the servient lot."

The lesson? When preparing an easement for your grantor client, be precise in detailing and limiting the permitted use. Consider excluding any use not expressly stated, and provide that the easement does not permit a change in grade.

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


