COMMERCIAL LITIGATION ISSUES OF INTEREST
November 2017

Your client, a co-trustee of a trust created by his deceased relative's will, signed a contract to sell real property held by the trust. The fully executed contract contained a handwritten correction on the first page striking the misidentification of your client as the "Executor" of his relative's estate, and identifying your client as "Trustee of the Last W+T" of his deceased relative. The contract's rider identified your client as "Executor," which was not corrected. The rider also contained a clause providing that any inconsistency with the contract would be controlled by the rider. Neither the contract nor the rider was signed by the other co-trustee, but all transfer documents necessary to close were signed by both trustees. The purchaser brought an action for return of the down payment on the ground that the contract was null and void because the named seller did not possess title, and the co-trustee did not sign the contract. You move to dismiss the action and for summary judgment, arguing that the discrepancy in identification of the owner was a mere scrivener's error. The purchaser cross-moved for summary judgment. You submit an affidavit of the other co-trustee stating that she was fully aware of the contract, participated in the transaction, and did not believe her signature was necessary. Will your client's contract be upheld?

The answer is no.

In Leonard H. Shapiro Revocable Living Trust v. Achenbaum,605858/2016, NYLJ 1202796204129, at *1 (Sup. Ct. Nassau Co. August 9, 2017), Defendant Warren Achenbaum was one of two "Trustees of the Trust Created Under Article Fifth of the Last Will and Testament of Elaine Achenbaum." Achenbaum signed a contract to sell real property belonging to the trust. Achenbaum received a down payment of $\$ 98,500$, which the plaintiffs sued to recover, claiming that the contract is null and void because the seller did not possess title, and because the co-trustee did not sign the contract.

The pre-printed contract misidentified the seller on the first page as "Executor of the Estate of Elaine Achenbaum." The misidentification was corrected by hand to say "Warren Achenbaum as Trustee of the Last W+T of Elaine Achenbaum."

The contract's uncorrected pre-printed rider identified Achenbaum as "Executor of the Estate of Elaine Achenbaum." Neither the contract nor the rider were signed by the second co-trustee, Anne Cacciola. The rider provided that any inconsistency between the contract and the rider would be controlled by the rider.

The title report required the contract to be amended to identify the title holder as "Warren Achenbaum and Anne Cacciola, as Trustees of the Trust Created Under Article Fifth of the Last Will and Testament of Elaine Achenbaum who died a resident of Nassau County on April 1, 2013."

Achenbaum moved to dismiss the plaintiffs' action and for summary judgment, arguing that the discrepancy between the seller listed in the contract and the name of the tiled owners was nothing more than a scrivener's error. An affidavit of the second co-trustee, Cacciola, states that she was fully aware of the sale at the time of the transaction and did not believe her signature on the contract was necessary. They argue that any defect was remedied by both Achenbaum and Cacciola being ready, willing, and able to close, and that both trustees had signed all transfer documents. The plaintiffs cross-moved for summary judgment.

The Court noted that no title is established by a deed from a person not in possession or who is not the owner, citing Gardner v. Hart, 1 N.Y. 528. The Court ruled that the contract was signed by Achenbaum as Executor of the Estate of Elaine Achenbaum, who had no interest in the property that was owned by the trust. The handwritten correction was meaningless, as the rider controlled. There was no valid contract, and the plaintiffs were entitled to the return of their down payment.

## The lesson?

A contract to sell real property must contain the name of the seller as it appears on the title documents, such that a title company will insure title transfer. If the seller is not properly named, then the purchaser may cancel the contract, because a deed from a seller who is not in possession or is not the owner establishes no title.
