
President's Post

COMMERCIAL LITIGATION ISSUES OF INTEREST

Your client rented her residential property to a new tenant for \$2,400 per month, relying on the assurances of your client's real estate broker that a background check showed the prospective tenant to be reputable. It took your client six months to evict the tenant for not paying a single month's rent. Your client later learned that the tenant had a criminal history. You sue the broker for breach of fiduciary duty, pleading a cause of action for the broker's failure to conduct a proper background check, and another cause of action pleading the broker's failure to reveal the results of the background check that the broker claimed it performed. The broker moved to dismiss the action, arguing that there was no contract that specifically required it to perform a background check. Therefore, according to the broker, its obligations were satisfied when it produced a ready, willing, and able tenant who signed a rental agreement. Will either of your causes of action survive the motion to dismiss?

The answer is yes.

In *Omabegho v. The Corcoran Group*, 654413/2016, NYLJ 1202795480381, at *1 (Sup. Ct. N.Y. Co., August 16, 2017), a broker employee of The Corcoran Group contacted the plaintiff about leasing out her apartment. The broker showed the property to a couple, who later signed an 18-month lease for \$2,400 per month. The tenants never paid any rent, and were eventually evicted six months after they moved in.

The complaint asserts various causes of action for breach of a broker's fiduciary duties of due care, undivided loyalty, and full disclosure, as provided in Real Property Law § 443 *et seq.* The complaint alleges that the broker assured the plaintiff that the potential tenants were reputable, and that the defendants had performed a background check. The plaintiff later learned that the tenants had a criminal history.

The Court granted the motion to dismiss the cause of action for failure to provide a thorough background check, noting that there was no specific contractual obligation to perform a background check. The Court explained that a real estate broker's duties to its client are satisfied by producing a ready, willing, and able tenant who executes a rental agreement, citing *Donnelly v. Margolis*, 265 A.D.2d523 (2d Dep't 1999).

However, the Court denied the motion to dismiss the cause of action for failure to disclose the tenant's criminal history. If the broker represented, as alleged, that it performed a background check, and described the tenant as reputable, then the broker had a duty to inform the plaintiff of the result of the background check, and not hide any poor history. The Court cited *John J. Reynolds, Inc. v. Snow*, 11 A.D.2d 653 (1st Dep't 1960), explaining that while there is no duty to investigate the suitability of the proposed tenant, there is a duty to fully and truthfully disclose knowledge that materially affected the transaction.

The lesson?

If your client owns residential real property and wants a real estate broker to have an obligation to investigate anything that materially affects

the transaction, then specifically provide for it in a contract. Otherwise, there is no duty for the broker handling residential real property to investigate. There is, however, a duty under Real Property Law § 443 *et seq.* for the broker who acts as agent for the landlord (or tenant or seller or buyer) of residential property, to disclose to its principal all facts known to the broker that materially affect the transaction.

THE RED MASS

The Red Mass is a solemn Mass invoking the guidance of the Holy Spirit on the deliberations of the Courts and on the endeavors of all members of the legal profession and law enforcement. Tradition holds that it came to be called "Red" symbolizing the scriptural "Tongues of Fire" descent of the gifts of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles.

This venerable custom began in Europe in the 13th century. From the time of Edward I, the Mass was offered at Westminster Abbey at the opening of Michaelmas Term. Similar celebrations are held in Paris and Rome.

In the New World, the practice was instituted by the Guild of Catholic Lawyers of the Archdiocese of New York in 1928, with Patrick Cardinal Hayes presiding. It provides a unique opportunity for the legal profession to seek the special gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, and fortitude.
